## VISEGRAD GRANTS -VISEGRAD GRANT, VISEGRAD GRANT+, STRATEGIC GRANT

Visegrad Fund annually allocates approximately EUR 10 million to hundreds of Visegrad cooperation projects and mobility programs across Central and Eastern Europe.

The project should be implemented in a consortium

*Visegrad grant*- The international consortium should be composed rom at least 3 V4 countries OR Bilateral cross-border cooperation of at least 2 organizations from 2 neighboring V4 countries also qualify for support with projects taking place within a 40-km radius from the border and focusing on a local issue

**Visegrad grant+-** active involvement of at least 3 V4 countries and 1 entity from the Eastern Partnership region (EaP) or the Western Balkans countries (WB) at minimum (3xV4 + 1xEaP/WB format). However, if the applicant is from one of the EaP or WB countries, it is enough to involve

two V4 countries in the project consortium, if another EaP/WB country is also involved (2xV4 + 2xEaP/WB format).

Strategic grant- Projects must be developed by organizations from all V4 countries

## SWISS NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION- MULTILATERAL ACADEMIC PROJECT

MAPS promotes knowledge circulation by providing cross-border collaboration opportunities with Bulgaria, Croatia, Hungary, Poland and Romania.

MAPS will be implemented through Joint Research Projects that are aimed at promoting collaborative projects with clearly defined goals, involving at least one applicant based in Switzerland and two to five additional applicants from two to five of the participating EU-13 countries. Research is carried out at the respective research facilities involved, while reciprocal visits and short stays may also be supported.

The maximum amount of funding for each team in each country is 350,000 francs for four years.

The JRPs have a duration of between 36 and 48 months. The call for proposals will be open to all research areas.

#### **INNOVATION LAB**

Objectives: Within the specific objective of promoting policy cooperation and innovative actions supporting all strands of the Programme, promoting a diverse, independent and pluralistic media environment and media literacy, thereby foresting freedom or artistic expression, intercultural dialogue and social inclusion, the priorities of the crosssectoral strand shall include: - to encourage innovative approaches to content creation, access, distribution, and promotion across cultural and creative sectors and with other sectors, including by taking into account the digital transition, covering both market and non-market dimensions;

Themes and priorities (scope):

The Cross Sectoral strand shall support the 'creative innovation lab', which shall:

(a) encourage new forms of creation at the crossroads between different cultural and creative sectors, for example through experimental approaches and the use of innovative technologies;

#### COST- EUROPEAN COOPERATION IN SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

COST funds interdisciplinary research networks.

The funding a COST Action receives covers the expenses of networking activities rather than research. As such is used to organise and fund events, Short-term Scientific Missions, Training Schools, communication activities, and virtual networking tools. An estimated €125,000 is made available for a COST Action in its first year and an average of €150,000 per year for the other 3 years.

Deadline: 23. October 2024.

Participation in COST Actions has led to significant results and follow-up in terms of the number of proposals submitted for collaborative research in Framework Programmes, with a success rate which more than triple the average success rates for these programmes (37% success rate). By funding networking, COST acts as a pre-portal for further research and innovation funding such as Horizon Europe, the European Union's Framework Programme for Research and Innovation.

#### WORLDWIDE CANCER RESEARCH

The goal is to support research that seeks to answer the difficult questions in cancer biology. WCR is looking for innovative and truly novel ideas that have the potential to revolutionise our understanding of cancer and how to beat it.

They award project grants of 12 to 36 months in length to support basic, fundamental or translational research into the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of cancer. They do not prioritise any field of research within this;

Welcome research that draws on epidemiological, behavioural and clinical data to provide a starting point for a new avenue of research. Multidisciplinary or discipline-hopping projects are encouraged where this helps stimulate innovation.

The principal investigator on the application must be a suitably qualified researcher (minimum of PhD followed by three years research experience, or equivalent qualification or research experience).

The WCR awards grants to principal investigators based at any not-for-profit research institute in the world.

The maximum budget allowed is £275,000, but it should be noted that most of the three-year grants we award have a budget of around £200,000.

The 2024 Grant Round is now open. The submission period will open on the 29th February, and the deadline for submitting your application is **5pm on April 2nd 2024**.

#### **FEBS-FELLOWSHIPS**

The FEBS Fellowships programme is a highly competitive and respected programme for earlystage researchers. Most of its schemes over the years have supported graduate students and earlycareer researchers in the molecular life sciences in the FEBS area to move to and carry out a period of research in a lab in a different FEBS country, thus broadening their experience and training, giving access to additional research techniques and expertise, and facilitating international collaboration.

Types of FEBS fellowships:

- Short-Term Fellowships are for scientists who have obtained their PhD degree within the past six years, and PhD students who have at least one published paper as a main author in an international scientific journal. Applications may be made at any time, but an application should be submitted at least three months before the proposed starting date
- Summer Fellowships are for PhD students and Master's students. Apply by 1 April each year (the call normally opens in February).
- Collaborative Developmental Scholarships are for PhD students or early/mid-career PhD holders in certain disadvantaged FEBS countries. Applications may be made at any time, but an application should be submitted at least three months before the proposed starting date.

#### ERC President explains changes in evaluation process of ERC grant proposals

The Scientific Council of the ERC introduced changes in the evaluation processes and evaluation forms for the 2024 calls for research proposals. In a report, ERC President Maria Leptin gives an overview of the changes, the discussions that led to them, and the reasoning behind them.

#### SOUTH KOREA TO JOIN HORIZON EUROPE

On 25 March the EU and Korea concluded negotiations on Korea's association to Horizon Europe. The signing of the Association Agreement is expected to take place in the second half of 2024, pending the completion of all necessary ratification procedures on both sides. This will enable Korea's participation in Horizon Europe as of 2025. Once signed, researchers and organisations in Korea will be able to receive funding under Pillar II of the Horizon from 2025 onwards.

# CANADIAN RESEARCHERS CAN CONTINUE TO PARTICIPATE IN ERC TEAMS

Researchers from Canada will continue to be able to join the teams of ERC grantees under a new agreement signed in Brussels during the R&I Days. A new 'implementing arrangement' was signed by the European Commission and the Canadian Tri-agency Institutional Programs Secretariat (TIPS) on 21 March.

Thanks to the new agreement, researchers supported by the Canada's Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC), the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, will be able to temporarily join research teams of ERC grantees. The agreement provides opportunities for Canada Research Chairholders and the Banting Postdoctoral Fellows to pursue research collaborations with their ERC-funded partners.

The parties acknowledged the constructive cooperation so far under a similar implementing arrangement signed by them on 27 October 2016 and they intend to work together to further intensify their cooperation in the context of the new agreement.

#### SWISS ENTITIES CAN NOW APPLY TO ERC'S 2024 CALLS

On 18 March 2024, the EC announced that the EU and Switzerland have officially launched their negotiations on a broad package of bilateral measures. These comprise official negotiations between the EU and Switzerland on Union programmes, which include the Horizon Europe and EURATOM Research & Training programmes.

The launch of these negotiations enables Swiss entities to apply and be evaluated **as prospective beneficiaries in the European Research Council calls of its 2024 Work Programme opening as of now. Swiss applicants will be treated as if Switzerland is an Associated Country throughout the process,** from admissibility and eligibility to evaluation, up until the preparation of grant agreements. However, grant agreements can only be signed if the association applies at that time.
