ERC Starting Grant 2026

The Starting Grant supports excellent Principal Investigators starting or having recently started their own independent research team or programme. A Starting Grant Principal Investigator should have already shown evidence of the potential for research independence, for example, by having produced at least one important publication as its main author or a publication without the participation of their PhD supervisor.

Starting Grants may be awarded up to a maximum of **EUR 1 500 000** for a period of **5 years**. The maximum size of the grants is reduced *pro rata temporis* for proposals of shorter duration.

Additional funding up to **EUR 1 000 000** can be requested to cover further eligible costs (e.g. start-up costs, major equipment, access to large facilities, major experimental and field work costs) when these are necessary to carry out the proposed work. The requests for additional funding must be duly justified in the proposal. For Principal Investigators re-locating to the EU or an Associated Country from elsewhere to take up their ERC grant the maximum additional funding shall be EUR 2 000 000.

The Principal Investigators shall have successfully defended their first PhD at least 2 and up to 7 years prior to 1 January 2026. Cut-off dates: Successful defence of PhD between 1 January 2019 and 31 December 2023 (inclusive).

Applications can be made in **any field of research**. The ERC's grants operate on a 'bottom-up' basis without predetermined priorities.

Research must be conducted in a public or private research organisation (known as a Host Institution/HI). It could be the HI where the applicant already works, or any other HI located in one of the EU Member States or [associated countries](#).

ERC Synergy Grant 2026

The aim is to provide support for a small group of **two to four Principal Investigators to jointly address ambitious research problems that could not be addressed by the individual Principal Investigators and their teams working alone**. Synergy projects should enable substantial advances at the frontiers of knowledge, stemming, for example, from the cross-fertilization of scientific fields, from new productive lines of enquiry, or new methods and techniques, including unconventional approaches and investigations at the interface between established disciplines. The transformative research funded by Synergy Grants should have the potential of becoming a benchmark on a global scale.

Principal Investigators must demonstrate the ground-breaking nature, ambition and feasibility of their scientific proposal. Principal Investigators must also demonstrate that their group can successfully bring together the scientific elements necessary to address the scope and complexity of the proposed research question.

One of the Principal Investigators must be designated as the Corresponding Principal Investigator. At any one time, one Principal Investigator per Synergy Grant Group except the Corresponding one can be hosted or engaged by an institution outside of the EU or Associated Countries.

Synergy Grants may be awarded up to a maximum of **EUR 10 000 000** for a period of **6 years**. The maximum award is reduced *pro rata temporis* for projects of a shorter duration. This does not apply to ongoing projects.

An **additional up to EUR 4 000 000** in total can be requested in the proposal to cover (a) eligible 'start-up' costs for Principal Investigators moving to the EU or an Associated Country from elsewhere as a consequence of receiving the ERC grant and/or (b) the purchase of major equipment and/or (c) access to large facilities and/or (d) other major experimental and field work costs, excluding personnel costs. As any additional funding is to cover major one-off costs it is not subject to *pro rata temporis* reduction for projects of shorter duration. All funding requested is assessed during evaluation.

Water4All 2025 Joint Transnational Call

The Joint Transnational Call is launched in the framework of the future European partnership and will support research and innovation projects aimed at addressing key challenges related to the link between water and human health, including water quality, contaminants, and water treatment technologies.

The Water4All JTC 2025 also considers the One Health (link here) approach, recognizing the interconnections between human, environmental, and animal health. It also prioritizes the development of accurate, efficient, and cost-effective water quality monitoring methods to improve risk assessment and management. Likewise, the advance in the implementation of sustainable water

treatment technologies is recognized as crucial for ensuring safe drinking water and effective sanitation.

Topics:

Topic 1: Waterborne contaminants & health risks: occurrence, behaviour, interactions and vulnerability

Topic 2: Innovative tools and technologies for Water quality and exposure monitoring

Topic 3: Water treatment and exposure mitigation

Topic 4: Governance, socio-economic innovation, and policy integration for water and health

Budget : Approximately 28 M€

Biodiversa+ BiodivConnect

The call is focused on fostering innovative research to be integrated into nature restoration practices for interconnected and well-functioning ecosystems and habitats, with special consideration for long-term sustainability and future-proofing of restoration efforts across spatial scales, including their evaluation.

The call covers restoration efforts for biodiversity in all types of ecosystems and habitats, in all regions of the world, encompassing all realms (terrestrial, marine, coastal and freshwater), supporting high-quality research and innovation projects on biodiversity and ecosystem restoration with holistic, systemic, and integrated approaches.

This call is arranged into three main topics that partly overlap. Project proposals can address one or more of these main topics.

Topic 1: Setting restoration targets and measuring success

Topic 2: Scaling and transferability of nature restoration efforts

Topic 3: Long-term sustainability of restoration efforts

To be eligible, transnational research consortia must be composed of eligible research partners from minimum 3 different countries financially participating in the call and requesting support from minimum 3 different Funding Organisations; including at least two different EU Member States or Horizon Europe Associated Countries.

At least 38 funding organisations from 30 countries are joining this call and have reserved, together with the European Commission, a total amount of ca. 40M€.

QuantERA 2025

The QuantERA III Consortium announces a new Call for international research projects in Quantum Technologies – QuantERA Call 2025.

Through this Call, the QuantERA Consortium seeks to boost cross-border collaboration and accelerate breakthrough research and cutting-edge engineering in quantum technologies, with funding from QuantERA partners and contribution from the European Commission.

Researchers are invited to apply for funding in one of two topics:

- Quantum Phenomena and Resources (QPR) – with the goal of laying the foundations for the QT of the future;
- Applied Quantum Science (AQS) – aimed at leveraging established quantum effects and concepts from quantum science, translating them into technological applications and developing new products.

All projects aligned with one of the two Call 2025 topics are expected to address one or more of the following areas:

- Quantum communication
- Quantum computing
- Quantum simulation
- Quantum sensing and metrology
- General quantum science

Countries participating in the Call: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czechia, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Türkiye, United Kingdom.

Projects may be performed over 24 or 36 months.

MSCA Doctoral Networks 2025

The objective of Doctoral Networks is to implement doctoral programmes by partnerships of organisations from different sectors across Europe and beyond to train highly skilled doctoral candidates, stimulate their creativity, enhance their innovation capacities and boost their employability in the long-term.

These doctoral programmes will respond to well-identified needs in various research and innovation areas, expose the researchers to the academic and non-academic sectors, and offer research training, as well as transferable skills and competences relevant for innovation and long-term employability.

Besides standard Doctoral Networks, incentives have been introduced to promote two specific types of doctorates as well.

1. **Industrial Doctorates.** They train PhD candidates who wish develop their skills and step outside academia, in particular in industry and business. Individual participants must be enrolled in a doctoral programme and jointly supervised by the academic and non-academic partners.

2. **Joint Doctorates.** They provide a highly integrated type of international, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary collaboration in doctoral training leading to a joint doctoral degree or multiple doctoral degrees awarded by the participating institutions. PhD candidates must be enrolled in a joint programme and be jointly supervised.

Doctoral Networks are open to international consortia of universities, research institutions, businesses, SMEs and other non-academic organisations. They should include

- at least three independent legal entities, each established in a different EU Member State or Horizon Europe Associated Country and with at least one of them established in an EU Member State
- on top of this minimum, other organisations from any country in the world can also join
- specific conditions apply to Industrial and Joint Doctorates

As from 2022, resubmission restrictions will apply for applications that received a score below 80% the previous year.

All areas of research may be funded and Doctoral Networks can last for up to 4 years (up to 5 years in the case of Joint Doctorate projects).

The duration of each fellowship is between 3 and 36 months (between 3 and 48 months in the case of Joint Doctorate fellowships).

Each beneficiary must recruit at least one doctoral candidate and can also organise secondments for them anywhere in the world.

The EU provides support for each recruited researcher in the form of

- a living allowance
- a mobility allowance
- if applicable, family, long-term leave and special needs allowances

In addition, funding is provided for

- research, training and networking activities
- management and indirect costs

MSCA Staff Exchanges

The Staff Exchanges action funds short-term international and inter-sectoral exchanges of staff members involved in research and innovation activities of participating organisations. The aim is to develop sustainable collaborative projects between different organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors (in particular SMEs), based in Europe and beyond.

Exchanged staff benefit from new knowledge, skills and career development perspectives, while participating organisations increase their research and innovation capacities.

Staff Exchanges are open to international consortia of universities, research institutions, businesses, SMEs and other non-academic organisations. They need to include

- at least three organisations in three different countries, two of which need to be located in a different EU Member State or Horizon Europe Associated Country
- above this minimum, the participation of organisations from any country is possible

- if all participating organisations are from the same sector (academic or non-academic), at least one must be from a non-associated Third Country

Staff Exchanges projects can last up to four years. The grant funds the mobility of seconded staff members from one month to one year.

Staff exchanges between organisations in EU Member States or Horizon Europe Associated Countries are required to be between different sectors (academic or non-academic), except if they are interdisciplinary. For partnerships with non-associated Third Countries, exchanges within the same sector and the same discipline are allowed.

Staff funded by Staff Exchanges

- can be researchers at any career stage, from PhD candidates to postdoctoral researchers, as well as administrative, technical or managerial staff involved in research and innovation activities
- can be of any nationality
- must be engaged in, or linked to, research and innovation activities at their sending organisation for at least one month prior to the secondment
- should return to their sending organisation after the secondment, to pass on their knowledge and foster collaboration

MSCA and Citizens: European Researchers' Night and Researchers at Schools 2026-2027

MSCA and Citizens aims to bring research and researchers closer to the public at large, to increase awareness of research and innovation activities and to boost public recognition of science and research education. It will show the role of the researcher for the society and economy, as well as the impact of researchers' work on citizens' daily lives. It also aims to raise the interest of young people in research and scientific careers.

The [European Researchers' Night](#) is the largest research communication and promotion event taking place across EU Member States and Horizon Europe Associated Countries, attended by over 1.5 million people every year.

The [Researchers at Schools initiative](#) aims to strengthen the connection between research and education, by bringing researchers to schools and other pedagogical and educational centres to encourage interaction with pupils at all levels of primary and secondary education. Researchers and pupils will meet to talk about current and future challenges of our societies and the related key role of research. Pupils will learn directly about research projects and activities addressing the EU priorities and main orientations.

Applicants are encouraged to submit proposals covering activities for both 2026 and 2027, including the organisation of two successive editions (2026 and 2027) of the European Researchers' Night and implementation of Researchers at Schools activities during the project duration.

The maximum requested EU contribution per proposal should not exceed EUR 350 000.

Partnerships and coordination at regional, national or cross-border levels will be strongly encouraged aiming at a good geographical spread and avoiding overlaps.

Where appropriate, synergies should be sought with the newly created Science Comes To Town initiative

MSCA Choose Europe for Science pilot action

The objective of MSCA Choose Europe for Science is to increase the attractiveness of European research careers by addressing the issue of precarity and offer excellent working conditions, turning the current challenge of brain drain in the research and innovation sector into brain gain.

The pilot action supports projects in which academic and non-academic organisations recruit postdoctoral researchers, with a view to offering longer-term employment beyond the project period.

A single legal entity in an EU Member State or a Horizon Europe Associated Country applies and is responsible for recruiting the researchers. Additional associated partners can be included in the project.

The total budget for this call is €22.5 million. A beneficiary can receive a maximum of €3.5 million for this call.

Projects should recruit at least 3 researchers for up to 5 years, with MSCA co-funding the first 2 to 3 years and the institutions providing the funding (with internal or external funds) for an additional 2 years.

Funding helps host organisations cover a fixed amount (Choose Europe for Science allowance) to support any cost items of the programme, equivalent to the minimum salary that researchers should receive during the first 2-to-3-year phase of the project (€6700), a long-term leave allowance and a special needs allowance, if applicable, for each supported researcher.

Researchers recruited onto selected MSCA Choose Europe for Science projects are supported during the full duration of the project (48 months or 60 months depending on the length chosen by the institution for the first phase).

They

- can be of any nationality
- should comply with the mobility rules: in general, they must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the recruiting organisation for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before the deadline of the co-funded programme's call
- can go on short-term secondments
- must have a doctoral degree. Researchers who have successfully defended their doctoral thesis but who have not yet formally been awarded the doctoral degree will also be considered as postdoctoral researchers and will be considered eligible to apply
- should not already be permanently employed by the organisation hosting them

The completed proposal, including all annexes, should be submitted **by 3 December 2025**.

European Excellence Initiative (EEI)

The European Excellence Initiative in its widening dimension aims to raise excellence in science and in knowledge valorisation of Europe's universities through cooperation. The action will engage with universities and empower them further to be actors of change in R&I.

By developing closer cooperation with economic and industrial partners within local and regional innovation ecosystems, academic researchers and support staff will be provided the opportunity to be trained in knowledge valorisation, entrepreneurship, access to finance, at any stage of their careers, and to take into account the variety of academic activities in their career assessment.

The European Excellence Initiative in its widening dimension is, in terms of scope, open to any network or alliance of higher education institutions, such as – but not limited to – European Universities alliances selected under Erasmus+. In case of participation in this call such alliances may be represented by limited number of their members and may include entities outside the alliance for specific themes to pursue the objectives of this call especially in view of industrial cooperation and/or outreach to regional innovation ecosystems. Under this call the centre of gravity of the action is in Widening countries. Applicants are expected to convincingly demonstrate this geographical focus conceptually and by allocation of the major share of the budget (at least 51%) to participants from Widening countries.

Activities need to focus on research and innovation conducted in the higher education sector. Educational activities such as Master or doctoral programmes are out of scope of this call.

Budget: 80 000 000 EUR;

Contribution: 2 000 000 - 5 000 000 EUR;

Indicative number of grants: 27.

The duration should not exceed 5 years.

Interreg Hungary-Slovakia HUSK-2501

Az Interreg VI-A Magyarország-Szlovákia program az Európai Unió (EU) 2021–2027-es többéves pénzügyi kerete alapján, a kohéziós politika részeként valósul meg. A program célja a magyar-szlovák határon fennálló adminisztratív és jogi akadályok felszámolása, a magyar és szlovák állampolgárok közötti kölcsönös bizalom kiépítése, valamint a határvidék környezetbarátabbá, versenyképesebbé és inkluzívabbá tétele. A program célkitűzéseit az Európai Bizottság által 2022. november 3-án jóváhagyott programdokumentum tartalmazza.

Minden projektet legalább egy magyar és egy szlovák partnerből álló partnerségben kell megvalósítani. Minden projektnek bizonyíthatóan határon átnyúló jellegűnek kell lennie, és lehetőséget kell teremtenie a partnerek közötti hosszú távú együttműködésre.

Interreg Central Europe Program

Az Interreg Central Europe Program meghirdette negyedik és egyben utolsó pályázati felhívását. Ezzel a közép-európai szervezetek számára ad lehetőséget transznacionális együttműködési ötleteket tartalmazó kapitalizációs stratégiai projektek benyújtására. A felhívás célja a közép-európai régiók funkcionális kapcsolatainak erősítése, a határok különböző áramlatokra gyakorolt hatásainak mérséklése egy versenyképesebb és ellenállóbb Közép- Európa érdekében.

Mindezt a program keretében támogatott projektek eredményeinek és jó gyakorlatainak az érdekeltek minél szélesebb körében történő elterjesztése és megismertetése révén kívánják elérni. Ezen elgondolás mentén, minimum követelmény, hogy a benyújtandó projektjavaslatok építsenek a 2021-2027-es Interreg Central Europe Program első két felhívásában kivitelezett projektek eredményeire (minimum két projekt), valamint az Interreg határon átnyúló (belső közép-európai határokat érintő) együttműködési projektek eredményeire (minimum két projekt). Ha a benyújtásra kerülő projekt tematikájához kapcsolható, akkor más programok által finanszírozott, releváns projektek kimenetei és eredményei is figyelembe vehetők. A pályázókat a Central Europe program több úton is segíti, így webináriumok szervezésével, nemzeti kapcsolattartókon keresztül, személyes konzultációk, valamint erre a célra felállított „helpdesk” útján.

A 23 millió eurós indikatív ERFA költségvetéssel meghirdetett felhívás keretében valamennyi programprioritás és specifikus célkitűzés mentén nyújthatók be pályázatok. A felhívás hivatalosan **november 27-én zárul.**

Zonta International Amelia Earhart Fellowships

Established in 1938, Zonta International's Amelia Earhart Fellowships memorialize famed air pioneer and Zontian, Amelia Earhart, who disappeared over the Pacific in 1937. By remembering Amelia Earhart through this fellowship, Zonta International encourages and supports women to expand their horizons by pursuing degrees and careers in aerospace engineering and space sciences. In the program's 87-year history, Zonta has awarded 1,794 Amelia Earhart Fellowships, totaling more than US\$12.2 million, to 1,365 Fellows from 80 countries. Up to thirty Fellowships of US\$10,000 each will be awarded in 2026.

Women of any nationality pursuing a Ph.D./doctoral degree who demonstrate a superior academic record and who are conducting research applied to aerospace engineering or space sciences are eligible. It is imperative that students be registered in a full-time Ph.D./doctoral program and have

completed at least one year of that program or have received a master's degree in an aerospace-applied field at the time the application is submitted. Applicants must not graduate from their Ph.D. or doctoral program before April 2027. Please note that post-doctoral research programs are not eligible for the Fellowship.

To apply for the Amelia Earhart Fellowship, applicants must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Be registered in a full-time Ph.D./doctoral program in research applied to aerospace engineering or space sciences, and have completed at least one year of that program or have received a master's degree in an aerospace-applied field at the time the application is submitted. A verification of current enrollment must be submitted with the application. Acceptance letters are not verification of enrollment and will not be accepted.
- Demonstrate a superior academic record at a recognized university or college with accredited courses in aerospace-applied studies as verified by official transcripts and recommendations.
- Provide evidence of a well-defined research program applied to aerospace engineering or space sciences in the application essay (in general scientific terms), the academic documents (references, transcripts, verification of enrollment) and the list of publications.
- Clearly demonstrate that the Ph.D. research program is directly related to aerospace/space sciences and furnish verification of the research program through at least one of the reference letters required with the application. The thesis supervisor or advisor and a university professor must each be one of the referees.
- Applicant must be registered in a full-time Ph.D./doctoral program by 15 November 2025 and must not graduate before April 2027.

Applications for ERC Advanced Grants 2025: Facts and figures

The ERC Advanced Grants 2025 call closed for applications on 28 August 2025. These are the preliminary data on the submitted proposals:

- The ERC received 3 329 proposals — 31% more than last year and 82% more than the year before that.

- The highest number of applications were submitted in Physical Sciences and Engineering (1 341), followed by Social Science and Humanities (1 013), and Life Sciences (975).
- Women submitted 840 proposals (25.2%), higher share than in the past two years.

MSCA PF receives record number of proposals

The fifth call of the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) [Postdoctoral Fellowships](#), part of the EU's research and innovation framework programme Horizon Europe, closed on 10 September 2025.

The European Research Executive Agency received 17,058 proposals. This is the highest number of proposals ever for any funding action in the 40 years of EU research and innovation framework programme. By comparison, 10,360 proposals were submitted in 2024. This represents an increase of 64.6%.

Through this call, the European Commission is expected to fund about 1,650 projects, with an indicative budget of €404.3 million.

This year's submitted proposals are distributed as follows

European Fellowships: 15,820 proposals

Global Fellowships: 1,238 proposals
